Since I have had some teaching experience, I know that this is the most daunting task the teacher is confronted with. Furthermore, this is a task the teacher has to fulfill every day anew. No lesson is the same, and today your class can be totally different than the day before. Students' attitude and participation in the classroom can fall from astonishing to frustrating within moments. To be aware of the classroom vibe is most crucial to teaching success. Standing in front of the classroom, the teacher has to be able to adapt to the students' condition, to engage with them and to arouse their interest; in short, the teacher has to be aware of his or her audience. As a teacher, you need to be able to open a communicative channel that allows you to convey your message adequately and at the same time reach your students. The objectives of this study were 1) to investigate the EFL students' writing ability after implementing genre-based approach with graphic organizers on argumentative writing, and 2) to explore the EFL students' perceptions toward genre-based approach with graphic organizers on argumentative writing. The sample were 30 eleventh grade students from a public school in Nakhon Nayok who enrolled in English Mastery course. The study employed a one-group pretest-posttest quasi-experimental design to measure the effects of the instruction. The data were collected quantitatively and qualitatively by using writing pretest and posttest, questionnaire, and semi-structured interview. A paired-sample t-test to compare students' ability before and after the treatment. The data from questionnaire and interview were analyzed by using means, standard deviations, and content analysis. The findings revealed that students' argumentative writing ability significantly improved after the implementation of the writing instruction at the significant level of .05 and students had positive perception towards the writing instruction. Students expressed that genre-based approach with graphic organizers could help them in characterizing the structure of argumentative writing and formulating their ideas. Participating the activities in GBA cycle with friends and teacher encouraged them to share their perspectives about the topics. The feedback students received could help to better their outlining. Nevertheless, some students were different in English proficiency and vocabulary knowledge so that could lead to the limitation in producing the arguments. Additionally, there was a difficulty in learning due to technology problems that the instruction was conducted online.

<p>This research is aimed at finding out: 1) To what extent graphic organizers can improve students' writing coherence; 2) How graphic organizers can be implemented effectively in improving students' writing coherence. The research method used in this study is classroom action research. The subject of the research was the students of class VIII B of a state Junior High School, Kebumen which consist of 32 students. In this research, the collected data were analyzed using a qualitative and quantitative technique. The result of the study shows that the students' mean score of writing coherence on pre-test is 56.35, then it improves in post-test 1 to 70.45 and 79.4 in post-test 2. Moreover, the result of the study also shows that graphic organizers can be implemented effectively if the teacher: (1) gives clear explanation and examples of graphic organizers; (2) guides and monitors the students during the process of writing; (3) provides exercise of grammar; and (4) keeps the students motivated in writing. Considering the result of the study, the researcher suggests that an English teacher had better implement graphic organizers in teaching writing in order to help the students improving their writing coherence. </p>

Graphic organizers were used in the teaching learning process by conducting action research. The action research used two cycles. The results were that the students' writing is better. The way they wrote topic sentence, supporting sentence, and concluding sentence were better than the previous one in the preliminary cycle. It was proved by the percentage of the students who got the score under the standard score of writing, namely, 75.

Graphic organizers are used in ELT classroom to help the students learn better. It refers to the way the students use graphic organizers in writing. The purpose of this study is to investigate the effect of graphic organizers on ELT students' writing quality. This study was a quasi-experimental research design. The experimental group was taught by using graphic organizers. The control group was administered by using conventional strategy. The participants of the research were the second semester students of English Department, in one of the private universities in Madiun. The data were analyzed by utilizing independent t-test and one-way ANOVA based on the level of significance at .05. The result of the study shows that there is a significant difference between the mean scores of the students in the experimental and control groups. The students who are taught by using graphic organizers are better than the students who are taught using conventional strategy. The students in the experimental group perform better on writing quality in terms of content, vocabulary, and mechanics than those who do in the control group. It can be concluded that graphic organizers have a significant effect on ELT students' writing quality. It is effective to be used in order to help the students write better. The students are successful in generating the ideas of writing and it can create a social community. We recommend for the future researchers to realize other various graphic organizer models into research.
