7. How do I cite an edited book?

- Editor's last name, First initial., & Middle initial. (Year of publication). Title of book in italics. Publisher's name.

8. How do I cite a book chapter?

- Chapter author's last name, First initial., & Middle initial. (Year of publication). Title of chapter. In Editor's last name, First initial., & Middle initial. (Ed.), Title of book in italics (pp. Page numbers). Publisher's name.

9. How do I cite a book series?

- Book author's last name, First initial., & Middle initial. (Year of publication). Title of book in italics. (Vol. Volume number, Series name). Publisher's name.

10. How do I cite an e-book?

- Follow the same format as a print book, but add "Retrieved from" and the URL after the publisher's name.

11. How do I cite a book in a running head?

- Author's last name and shortened title of book (Year of publication).

12. How do I cite a book in a parenthetical citation?

- (Author's last name, Year of publication).

13. How do I cite a book in a reference list?

- Alphabetize by author's last name. Include a "References" heading.

14. How do I indent entries in a reference list?

- First line flush left, subsequent lines indented 5 spaces.

15. How do I format page numbers in a reference?

- Write out "pp." followed by the specific page numbers.

16. How do I cite a book in Chicago style?

- Follow the Chicago Manual of Style guidelines.

17. How do I cite a book in MLA style?

- Follow the Modern Language Association guidelines.

18. What is the DOI for a book?

- A unique identifier assigned to electronic books. Include it in the reference after the publisher's name.

19. How do I find the DOI for a book?

- Check the book's copyright page or online sources like Google Scholar.

20. What is the ISBN for a book?

- A unique identifier assigned to each edition of a book. Include it after the publisher's name.

21. How do I find the ISBN for a book?
