Troubleshooting Common Issues on a 2006 Dodge Caravan**

Code P0688: Fuel Pressure Regulator 2 Control Circuit High

- Indicates an issue with the fuel pressure regulator, which controls fuel pressure to the engine.

How Many Quarts of Oil for a 2006 Dodge Grand Caravan?

- Most Grand Caravan models require 5.7 quarts of oil with a filter change.

Setting the Clock on a 2006 Dodge Caravan

- Press the "Hr" button to change the hour, and the "Min" button to change the minutes.
- Press "Set" to confirm the changes.

Code P2308: Ignition Coil G Primary Control Circuit

- Indicates a fault in the ignition coil that delivers spark to cylinder G.

Fixing Code P0688

- Replace the fuel pressure regulator.
- Inspect wiring and connections for damage or corrosion.

Code P0685: ECM/PCM Power Relay Control Circuit Open

- Indicates an open circuit in the relay that supplies power to the engine control module (ECM) or powertrain control module (PCM).

Best Oil for a 2006 Dodge Caravan

- Use a 5W-20 synthetic blend oil, which meets the manufacturer's specifications.

Transmission Fluid for a Dodge Grand Caravan

- Most models require approximately 3.7 quarts of transmission fluid.

Oil Capacity for a 3.6 V6 Dodge Caravan

- The 3.6L V6 engine requires 6.6 quarts of oil with a filter change.

Timing Belt or Chain on a 2006 Dodge Grand Caravan

- It has a timing chain, which typically lasts the lifetime of the engine.

Code P0073: Ambient Air Temperature Sensor Input Circuit High

- Indicates a sensor fault or wiring issue that provides ambient air temperature information to the ECM/PCM.

Key Programming for a 2006 Dodge Caravan

- Requires a scan tool to program a new key at a dealership or qualified auto repair shop.

Code P0420: Catalyst System Efficiency Below Threshold (Bank 2)

- Indicates an issue with the catalytic converter on Bank 2 of the exhaust system.

AC Reset on a Dodge Caravan

- Disconnect the negative battery terminal for 10 minutes and reconnect it.

Code P0140: Oxygen Sensor Heater Circuit Malfunction (Bank 1 Sensor 2)

- Indicates a fault in the oxygen sensor's heater circuit on Bank 1 of the exhaust system.

Fixing PCM Code

- Replace the PCM relay fuse.
- Inspect wiring and connections for damage.

PCM Relay Fuse Function

- Provides power to the PCM, which controls various engine functions.

ECM Relay Location

- Usually located in the underhood fuse box or near the ECM on the engine firewall.

Code P0685 Dodge Caravan

- Same as Code P0685 ECM/PCM Power Relay Control Circuit Open.

ECU Relay Failure Symptoms

- Engine may not start or run properly.
- Check engine light illuminates.

Code P0686: Engine Controls Ignition Relay Control Circuit Low Voltage

- Indicates a low voltage condition in the relay circuit that controls ignition.

ASD Relay Location

- Located in the underhood fuse box.

Auto Shutdown Powertrain Control Module (PCM)

- A protective feature that shuts down the engine if certain conditions are met, such as high engine temperature or low oil pressure.

Code for ECM/PCM Power Relay

- Can vary by model year, but typically uses a 20- or 30-amp relay.
