How does the book 8 of Dexter end? Dexter sets it up and goes to leave the ship to be rescued by Deborah in his boat. Gravely weakened from blood loss, Dexter manages to jump off the yacht before it explodes, losing consciousness while sinking into the sea.

What serial killer is Dexter based on? Pedro Rodrigues Filho is the real-life vigilante killer who acted as the inspiration behind the fictional character Dexter Morgan. Pedro was born in Brazil and lived there his entire life.

Who kills Rita in the books? Dexter realizes that circumstantial evidence implicates him as Jackie's and Robert's murderer, and that the only person who can exonerate him is Rita. However, he discovers that Rita is dead, having been murdered by Robert.

Why was Rita killed off? Using Rita's death in *Dexter* as a dramatic pivot point for the protagonist emphasizes a narrative dependence on violence against women as a form of emotional manipulation.

Did Dexter really love Rita? Rita, although somewhat naive and blindly trusting of others, did ultimately mean a lot to Dexter, even though he claimed in the first season to be incapable of loving her. As *Dexter* progressed into its later seasons after Rita's shocking death, Dexter had two other main love interests, Lumen

Pierce and Hannah McKay.

Who killed Rita in Dexter? This was cut short when Rita was murdered in "The Getaway" by Arthur Mitchell aka the Trinity Killer, as punishment for Dexter's constant pursuit of him—and to remind Dexter that he can never escape his demons.

What happens to Dexter in the book One Day? She writes and performs plays, but they are unsuccessful. Dexter travels the world, drinking and womanizing. Eventually Emma and Dexter each relocate to London, where Emma becomes a waitress in Kentish Town, at a Tex-Mex restaurant, while Dexter becomes a television presenter.

Are Dexter books better than series? My suggestion would be to watch series than reading novel. the books are goofier and static while the TV show is gritty, more dangerous—with characters who evolve over time. The TV series also has higher stakes. There's a greater sense of urgency that there will be consequences for Dexter—and Debra, too.

Why did Dexter dump Deb in the ocean? The previous run ended with Dexter mercifully pulling the plug on sister Deb (Jennifer Carpenter), dumping her body in the ocean and driving his boat into the eye of a hurricane to certain death. His rationale was to keep loved ones from getting hurt anymore, including Harrison.

Why did Dexter end so abruptly? They originally wanted to end the show with Dexter's death, a fitting end to the life of a serial killer. However, Showtime wasn't big on killing off the protagonist of their very popular show, so they had to come up with another solution.

How did Hannah poison Deb? Debra warns Hannah that she will pay for what she has done. Hannah then spikes Debra's drinking water with Xanax, causing her to pass out while driving.

Why do people hate the Dexter finale? The first Dexter ending became polarizing among audiences and critics, primarily due to it throwing away much of the series' character development, while concluding on an ambiguous ending, avoiding whether or not Dexter deserved to pay for his crimes, and rushing the last episode's storyline.

Why does Dexter always cut the cheek? Dexter's trophy signature is slicing the victim's right cheek with a surgical scalpel to collect a small blood sample, which he preserves on a microscope slide. In the TV show, Dexter keeps blood slides from all his victims neatly organized in a wooden filing box, which he hides inside his air conditioner.

Was there an alternate ending to Dexter? But Dexter: New Blood's ending also wasn't what Phillips originally envisioned, meaning it could be third time lucky for him to use his alternate ending, with Dexter actually alive in Dexter: Resurrection.

Can you be audited twice? There is no limit on how many times the IRS may audit a taxpayer or audit tax returns. However, the IRS cannot audit you for a particular tax year again, unless you or the Secretary of the Treasury request the new audit.

What is in house internal audit function? In-house internal audit departments operate without being contracted out to an external firm. The internal auditor may be part of a larger department or division, such as

finance, operations or IT.

What is the meaning of ISA audit? 1. This International Standard on Auditing (ISA) deals with the independent auditor's overall responsibilities when conducting an audit of financial statements in accordance with ISAs.

What is the purpose of the internal audit unit? The role of internal audit is to provide independent assurance that an organisation's risk management, governance and internal control processes are operating effectively.
